LUMBIER

1 Gorge Interpretation Center. Tourist Office

Touristic and enviromental materials designed to enjoy and get to know the world of the river gorges close to Lumbier.



2 Main Altarpiece

The Baroque Main Altarpiece -declared Heritage of Cultural Interest-, decorated with 16th-century low reliefs and a Renaissance carving of the Virgin, is the highlight of the church.



3 Pottery square

It houses a large pictorial wall, a statue of a potter and an interpretive table in memory of this traditional trade in the town.



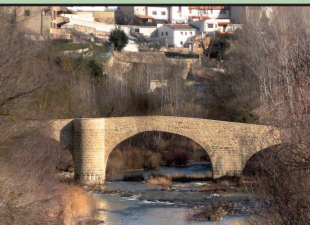
4 Puente de la Ida Bridge

Bridge over the River Irati, probably from the Middle Ages, although it has been modified. It was destroyed to prevent the advance of the French Army during the Spanish War of Independence, in 1811.



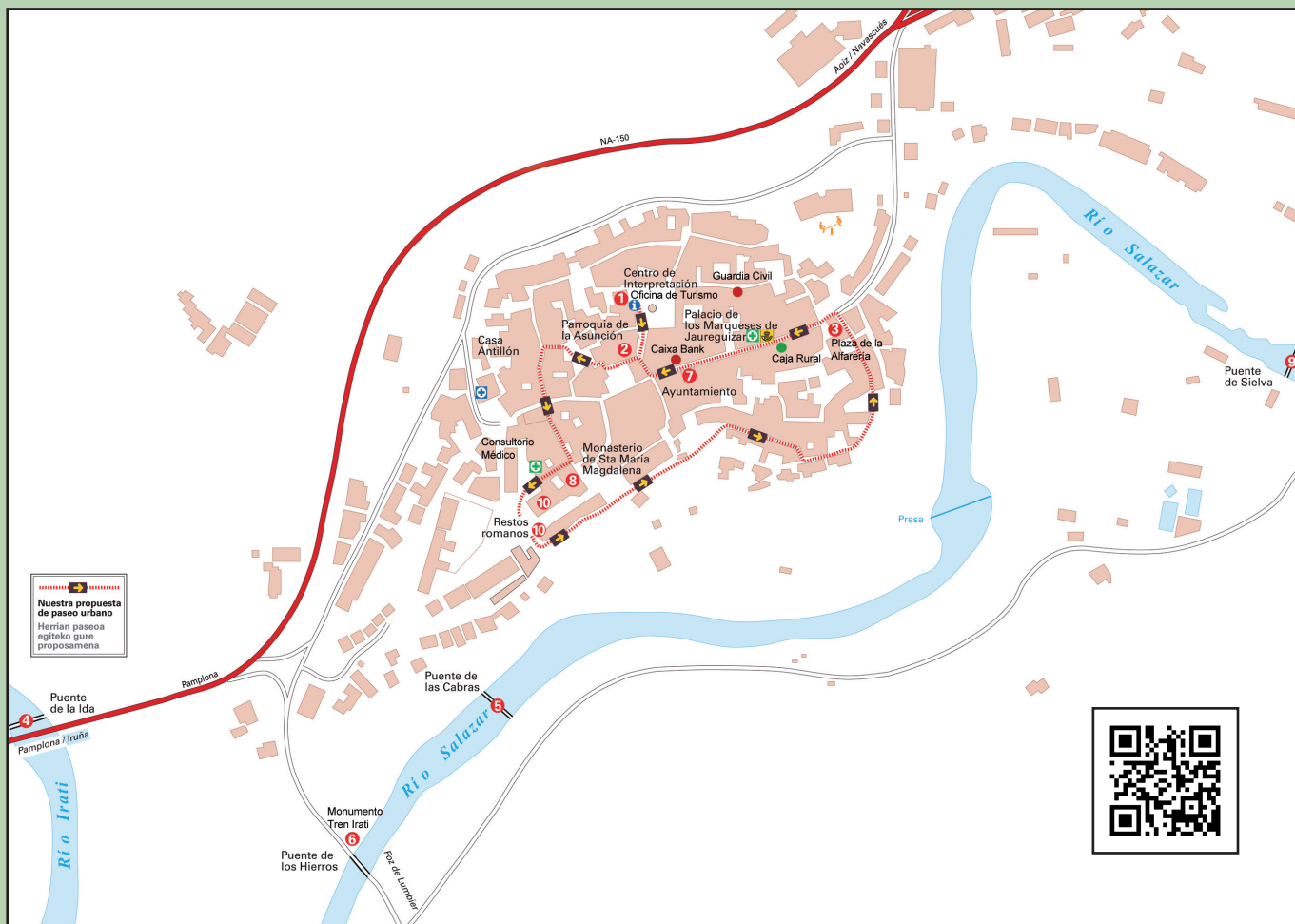
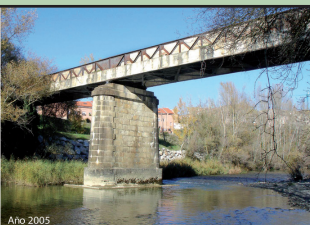
5 Bridge of the Goats

This medieval-style bridge over the River Salazar witnessed the Battle of the Trinity in 1875, during the Third Carlist War. Local pilgrims walk through it on their annual way to the Trinity Chapel.



6 Iron Bridge

Named like this due to its original metal structure, it was purpose-built in 1909 for the Irati Train to cross over the Salazar River.



7 City Hall

The oldest City Hall built in Navaarre is a Renaissance construction from the late 15th century, made with bricks combined with ashlar masonry. It was rebuilt after being damaged by a fire near 1870.



8 Saint Mary Magdalene Monastery

Built at the end of the 16th century and abandoned by the Benedictine nuns in 1991, nowadays it has been restored and serves as a community center.



9 Sielva Bridge

Upstream of the Bridge of the Goats over the River Salazar, it was probably built in the Middle Ages, with a typical structure of that period and steep slopes on both sides of the bridge.



10 Roman Remains

A 2nd-century Roman mosaic -now displayed on the façade of the building- was found inside the Monastery, next to which we can find these Roman remains. We can also see remains of some walls, used as house supports in the Middle Ages.
